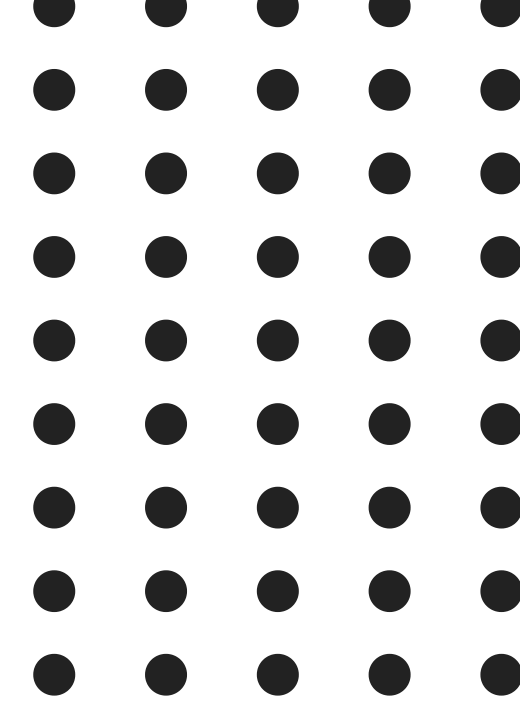
Example from the Czech side: Development Challenge and Solution

The project primarily addresses the problem of insufficient use of sustainable production technology in textile production and design, and ineffective management of waste in BiH, including the lack of recycling awareness and practice (SDG 12). Secondly, it addresses limited opportunities and low employment rates for women and girls who form the majority of potential workforce in fashion and textile industry (SDG 5). Finally, through promoting a sustained effort at the creative use of waste material and making it attractive for urban customers, impact on non-renewable energy sources used in traditional textile production is decreased (SDG 7).

Despite relative poverty rate of 16.9% population below poverty line (Household Budget Survey, 2015), households in BiH currently spend 4.9% of their monthly expenditures on clothing and footwear, which is similar to spending habits of Czech population (Czech Statistical Office, 2016). This trend is more significant in urban areas where household consumption is on average 16% higher (HBS, 2015). Bosnian-Herzegovinian urban youth population is very fashion conscious, which, however, contrasts with the lack of awareness of sustainable means of production, responsible waste use, and recycling. The project's intervention logic is thus built on the assumption that fashion presents a credible, attractive and locally relevant medium for educating on environmental awareness, while at the same time it is itself an important object of intervention due to its high toll on non-renewable energy sources and raw material.

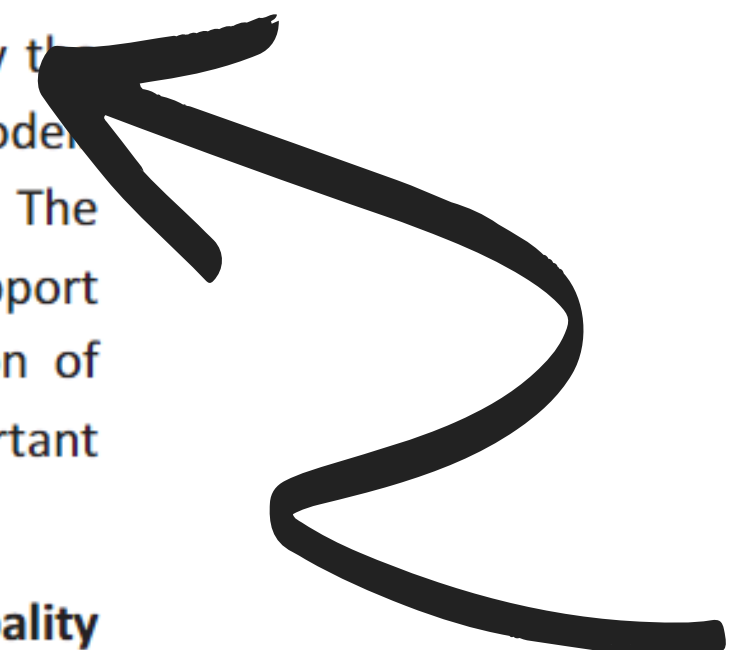


Example from the Czech side: Applicant's Experience

Company EVECO Brno is dedicated to the research and development of innovative waste incineration technologies. The research activity is evident from participation in research projects supported by the European Union and the Czech government. The company protects the research results by utility models and strives for pushing of the unique technologies and Czech know-how on foreign markets. The company has experience with foreign projects in developing countries, where thanks to similar support for finding suitable project partner and feasibility studies realization, technologies for utilization of alternative energy sources for heating of municipal buildings were implemented. An important reference from abroad is the project:

Utilization of renewable sources of energy for system of central district heating in municipality Nemila, Bosnia and Herzegovina, 2011-2013

- Supported by Czech development agency.
- General contractor: Association of companies EKO-CZT Nemila, MEVOS, ltd.
- Turn-key delivery of functional technological unit of biomass boiler with power output of 3 MW_{th}, including fuel buffer stock in frame of realization of the project.

Example from the Czech side: Work Plan and Activities

Proposed workplan corresponds to our experience with successful implementation of smart-city platform projects in other countries:

- A. Study trip of representatives of the City of Tuzla and municipal companies to the Czech Republic (5 people for 3 working days) to familiarize themselves with smart city projects in the Czech Republic and possibilities of the smart city platform (on the example of the City of Zlín).

- C. Preparation of a draft of smart city platform implementation plan in the City of Tuzla.
Outcome: Draft of smart city platform implementation plan (min. 5 standard pages in English)
Timeline: Months 3-4
